We have set our *Midsummer Night's Dream* once upon a time in Ireland . . . where visions appear of ancient Athens, a beach in India, a fairy tale forest, and a community theatre.

Shakespeare's mad dash through these landscapes is a celebration of storytelling as communal dreaming. There are serious, sometimes dark, themes at work concerning love, lust, tyranny, marriage, and transformation. But I would like to stress that in the end this play is a lot of fun. For those of you who are revisiting the *Dream*, I hope it continues to work its magic. If this is your first *Dream*, my advice is to jump down the rabbit hole and enjoy the trip with us.

A DRAMATURG'S NOTE

Life is a dream. Love flutters like a butterfly in the quarreling wind. Spirits emerge from the shadows, exciting or menacing. Ordinary men and women love to tell stories – the play's the thing! (wrong play, but ...) – so Pyramus and Thisbe takes to the stage, a mirror to the indolent fooling of our four privileged lovers. There's a lot of classical rumbling in this play. Ovid, Terence are all here, as characters from myth and the world of magical thinking erupt on the suburban lives of two boys and two girls. "Lovers, to bed, 'tis almost fairy time."

MUSIC ~~

Original and traditional music are hallmarks of every Curtain production. We were inspired this time by the music of Ireland-particularly the jigs and reels from that country's rich dance tradition. Besides selecting several tunes from that repertoire, Don Clark composed two song melodies and Hal Hughes composed incidental music.

Steve Coleman (Set Designer) is a longtime artist in Mill Valley and award-winning set designer. He is known for his loving, often fantastical creations of everything from small models to the elegant reborn performing spaces at the 142 Throckmorton Theatre. Steve is a founding member of the Curtain.

Magdalena del Castillo (*Snug, a Joiner/Lion*) is happy to be part of Curtain's team! Her love for Shakespeare sparked in her middle school English class during a production of *Midsummer*; she played Bottom. She earned her BFA in Theatre at Southern Oregon University in Ashland, home of the Oregon Shakespeare Festival.

Michele Delattre (Director/Band) is a founding member of the Curtain Theatre. She has performed in Shakespeare festivals across the country, but her favorite home is this magical company in Old Mill Park. Glen has appeared in Shakespeare in Love at NTC, Much Ado About Nothing at COM and nine shows with Marin Shakespeare. He directed Much Ado at Actors Ensemble of Berkeley. He founded the Free Civic Theater and the Theater of Others, staging fifty productions from 2000-2019.
